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## Domestic Homicide in New York State 2022

This report presents a statistical account of domestic homicides reported by police departments and sheriffs' offices in 2022 to the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS).

**Definitions:** Domestic homicide is defined as a murder or non-negligent manslaughter in which the victim was known to have a domestic relationship with the offender, such as being an intimate partner or other family member.<sup>1</sup>

An "intimate partner" relationship includes spouse, ex-spouse, heterosexual or same-sex partner or ex-partner, whether or not the victim and offender lived together at the time of the incident or previously.<sup>2</sup> "Other family" member includes child under 18,<sup>3</sup> parent, sibling or other family relationship.

**Data:** The data analyzed for this report are taken from the Supplementary Homicide Report submitted by police agencies to DCJS as of August 7, 2023.

Submitted as part of New York State's Uniform Crime Reporting program, the supplementary report includes case-level information on all criminal homicides reported to police or

sheriffs and includes the following information: victim-offender relationship; demographics of victims and offenders, such as sex, race/ethnicity and age; and the type of weapons used.

**Overview:** In this report, domestic homicides are compared to the total number of homicides statewide and in the state's two regions: the five counties (also known as boroughs) of New York City and Non-New York City, defined as the remaining 57 counties outside the five boroughs.

This report also details the demographic characteristics of all homicide and domestic homicide victims and the types of weapons used. Specific details also are included about:

- Intimate partner homicide, which tends to be the most frequent type of domestic homicide;
- Homicides involving minor child victims; and
- Homicides with other family members as victims.

Statistics for the 10-year period from 2013 to 2022 and county-specific data also are included.

### Major Findings

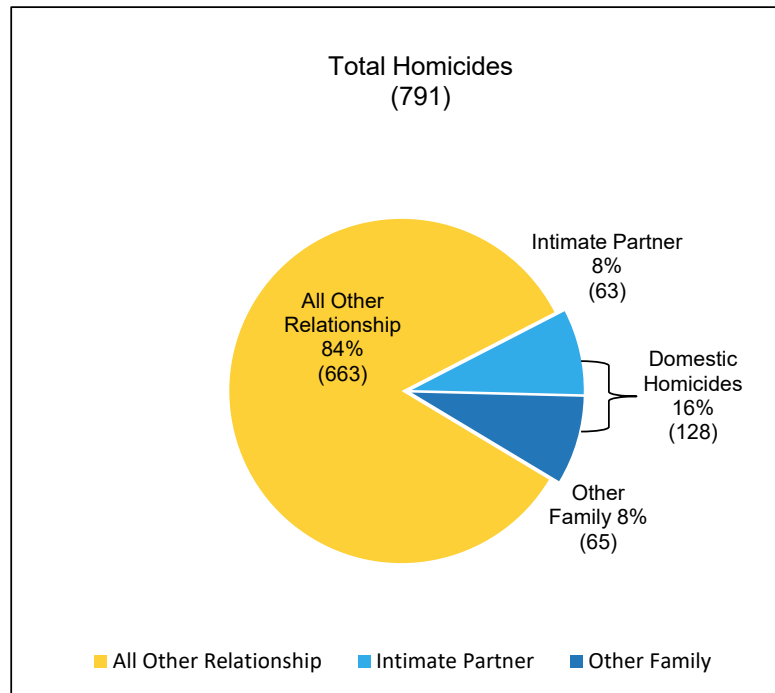
- In 2022, domestic homicides accounted for 16 percent of all homicides reported in the state (128 of 791).
- Domestic homicides increased 3 percent compared to 2021, while non-domestic homicides decreased by 13 percent.
- Statewide, there were 63 intimate partner homicides reported in 2022, a 2 percent decrease compared to 64 in 2021.
- Intimate partners were responsible for 38 percent of homicides of female victims ages 16 and up, compared to 1 percent of male victims ages 16 and up.
- Knives, cutting instruments or blunt objects were most often used in intimate partner homicides (28 of 63 or 44 percent).
- A firearm was used in 24 percent of intimate partner homicides in New York City. Outside New York City, 41 percent of these homicides involved a firearm.

<sup>1</sup> Homicide is defined as "the willful killing of one human being by another." *Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook*. Murder and non-negligent manslaughter refer to crimes in New York State Penal Laws Section 125.15 through Section 125.27 and include: murder in the first and second degree, aggravated murder, aggravated manslaughter in the first and second degree, and manslaughter in the first and second degree.

There were 791 homicides reported in 2022, and, of those, 128 (16 percent) involved a domestic relationship.

The victims and offenders were intimate partners in 63 of 128 domestic homicides. Intimate partner victims represented 49 percent of domestic homicide victims and 8 percent of all homicide victims.

The remaining 65 domestic homicide victims were killed by other family members. Those victims were most commonly the child, parent, or sibling of the offender.

Nine domestic homicide incidents reported in 2022 involved multiple victims.

Table 1 compares domestic and other homicides in New York City and Non-New York City in 2022. Of the 791 homicides reported statewide, 438 (55 percent) occurred in New York City and 353 (45 percent) occurred in the Non-New York City region. Appendix A details regional and county statistics.

- There were more homicide victims in New York City than in Non-New York City, but the percentage of homicides reported as domestic was higher outside of the five boroughs: 18 percent of all reported homicide victims outside of New York City were killed in domestic incidents.
- New York City reported 64 domestic homicide victims, accounting for 15 percent of all homicide victims in the five boroughs.

Table 2 compares the sex of homicide victims who were 16 and older, statewide and by region. The vast majority, 95 percent, or 749 of 791 homicide victims, were 16 and older.

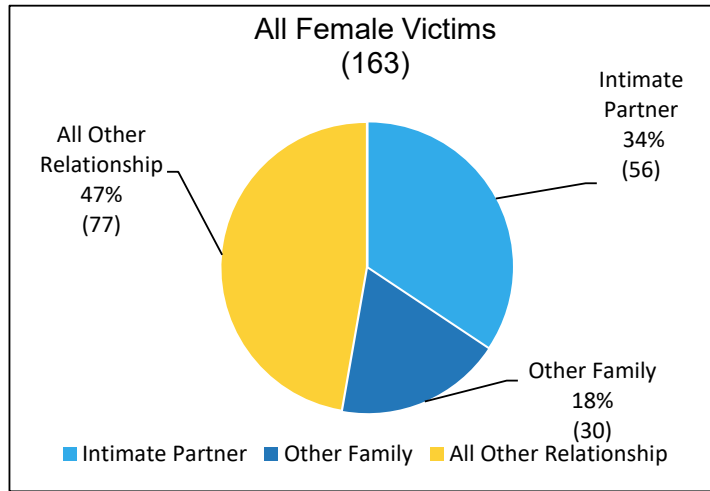
- Statewide, there were 149 female homicide victims who were age 16 or older, and, of those, 38 percent were killed by their intimate partner.
- In New York City, 33 percent of female victims were killed by an intimate partner, compared to 43 percent in Non-New York City.

<sup>4</sup> For this report, intimate partners include spouse, ex-spouse, heterosexual partner or ex-partner, and same-sex partner or ex-partner, whether or not the victim and offender were living together at the time of the homicide or had previously lived together. Domestic homicide statistics reported by NYPD include homicide victims who were killed in the incident, but were not intimate partners or members of the same family as the offender. These victims are excluded from domestic victim counts in this report.

## Domestic Homicides vs. All Homicides by Victim Sex

Charts 2 and 3 detail the number of female and male domestic homicide victims by type of relationship to the offender, compared to all homicide victims in the state. The sex was reported “Unknown” for one non-domestic homicide victim.

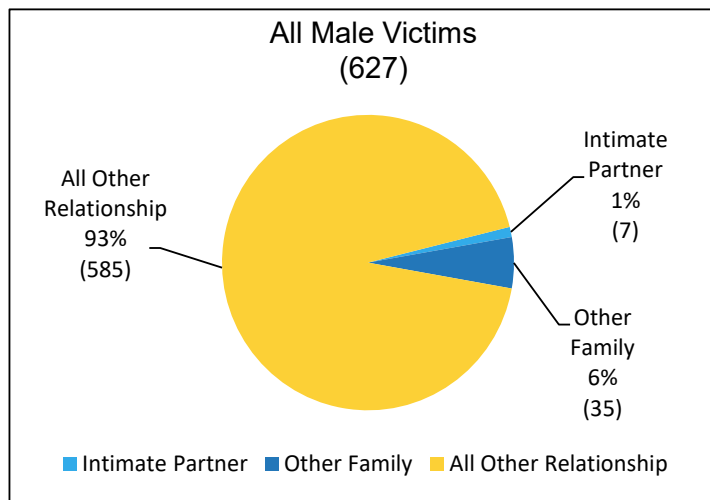

- Statewide, 53 percent of the 163 female homicide victims were killed in a domestic homicide, either by an intimate partner or other family member.
- Among the 77 female homicide victims killed in a non-domestic homicide, 21 were killed by a stranger, 14 were killed by a friend, 8 were killed by an acquaintance or someone otherwise known to the victim. The victim-offender relationship was listed as unknown or not reported for 34 female victims.

- The vast majority of males were killed in a non-domestic incident: 585 (93 percent) of 627.
- In stark contrast to female homicide victims, only seven of the 627 (1 percent) male homicide victims were killed by an intimate partner and 35 (6 percent) by another family member.
- Among the 585 males killed in a non-domestic homicide, 105 were killed by a friend, 81 were killed by a stranger, 53 were killed by an acquaintance or someone otherwise known to the victim, and seven were killed by a neighbor. The victim-offender relationship was listed as unknown or not reported for 339 male victims.

## Demographics of Homicide Victims

Table 3 presents the sex and race/ethnicity of domestic and other homicide victims, by region. A synopsis of the statistics in this table follows on Page 6.

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## **Sex**

- The victims of intimate partner homicides were most frequently female: 89 percent (56 of 63). Females were victims in 46 percent of domestic homicides by other family (30 of 65) and 12 percent (77 of 663) of all other homicides.
- Males were most often the victims in non-domestic homicides: 88 percent (585 of 663).

## **Race and Ethnicity**

### **Non-Domestic Homicides**

- The majority (84 percent) of non-domestic homicide victims were either Black (64 percent) or Hispanic (20 percent).

### **All Domestic Homicides**

- In domestic homicides, 45 percent (57) of victims were Black, 29 percent (37) were White and 20 percent (26) were Hispanic.
  - New York City reported more Black (37) and Hispanic victims (17) of domestic homicide than White victims (5).
  - In Non-New York City, there were more White victims (32) of domestic homicide, than Black (20) or Hispanic (9).

### **Intimate Partner Homicides**

- Among the 63 intimate partner homicide victims statewide, 41 percent (26) were Black, 27 percent (17) were White, and 27 percent (17) were Hispanic.
  - In New York City, there were 29 intimate partner homicides: 15 victims were Black, 11 were Hispanic, and two were White.
  - In Non-New York City, there were 34 intimate partner homicides: 15 victims were White, 11 were Black and 6 were Hispanic.

Table 4 presents domestic homicide victims by age group and type of relationship.

- Almost half (47 percent) of the domestic homicide victims reported in New York State in 2022 were between 20 and 49 years old.
- Ten intimate partner victims were younger than age 30 in both Non-New York City and in New York City.
- Non-New York City had more intimate partner victims who were age 30 through 49, compared to New York City (19 versus 12).

## Child Victims of Domestic Homicide

Table 5 presents demographics of child victims of domestic homicide. Child victims are those younger than 18 who were killed by a parent, a parent's intimate partner or another family member.

- Statewide, there were 23 child victims of domestic homicide: 15 in New York City and eight outside New York City.
- Of those 23 child victims, 78 percent (18) were younger than five years old, and, of those, 10 were infants.
- A parent was the perpetrator in 20 child victim homicides, an intimate partner of a parent was the perpetrator in two, and a sibling in one.

## Adult Family Member Victims of Domestic Homicide

- For purposes of this report, an adult is defined as 18 years old or older.
- Statewide, there were 42 adult victims of domestic homicide: 19 parents; 12 other family members, eight siblings, one child, one step-child, and one step-parent (*data not shown in table*).



## Weapons Used in Domestic Homicide

Table 6 details the type of weapon used in domestic homicides and the relationship of the victims to the offenders. Weapon types include firearms; knives, cutting instruments or blunt objects; personal weapons (hands, feet and teeth); and miscellaneous weapons (motor vehicle, fire and poison).

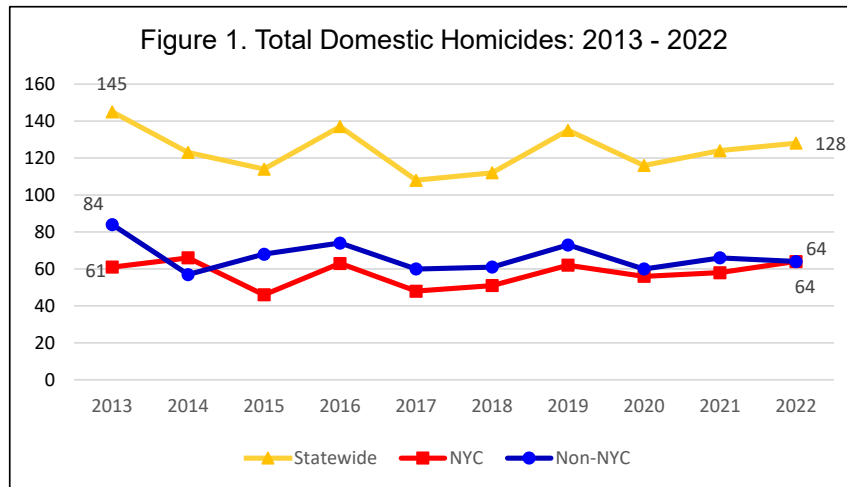

- A knife, cutting instrument or blunt object was the most common weapon used in all domestic homicides (57 of 128), followed by firearms (30 of 128), miscellaneous weapons (22 of 128), and personal weapons (16 of 128).
- Firearms were used in 24 percent of intimate partner homicides in New York City, compared to 41 percent of those that occurred outside New York City.
- In New York City, a knife, cutting instrument or blunt object was the weapon used against 59 percent of victims in intimate partner homicides.
- In Non-New York City, a knife, cutting instrument or blunt object was the weapon used against 32 percent of victims in intimate partner homicides.
- Among the 65 other family domestic homicides, 45 percent involved a knife, cutting instrument, or blunt object; 20 percent involved personal weapons (hands, feet, teeth); 18 percent involved miscellaneous weapons, and 14 percent involved a firearm. The weapon used was not reported for 3 percent of other family domestic homicides.

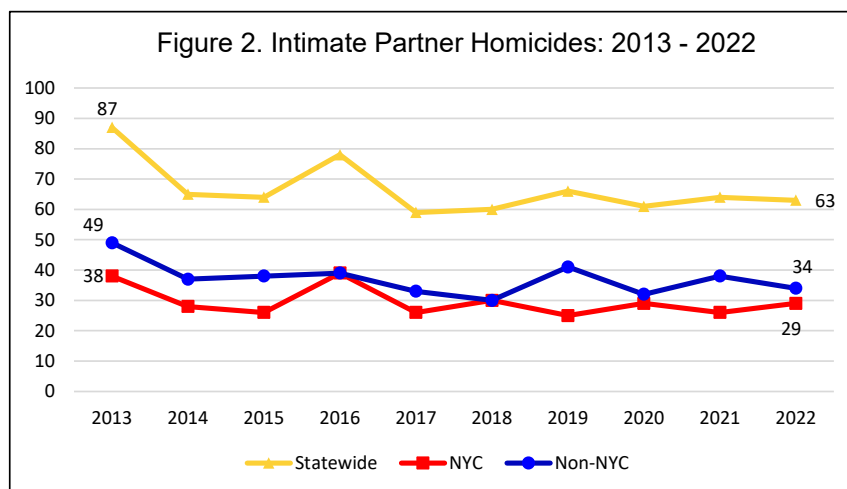
## Trends in Domestic Homicide 2013 - 2022

The Division of Criminal Justice Services first published a Domestic Homicide Report in 2008, analyzing data from 2007. - Statewide, 2013 was the year with the most domestic homicides (145) and 2017 had the fewest (108).
- New York City had the fewest domestic homicides in 2015 (46), while Non-New York City reported the fewest in 2014 (57).

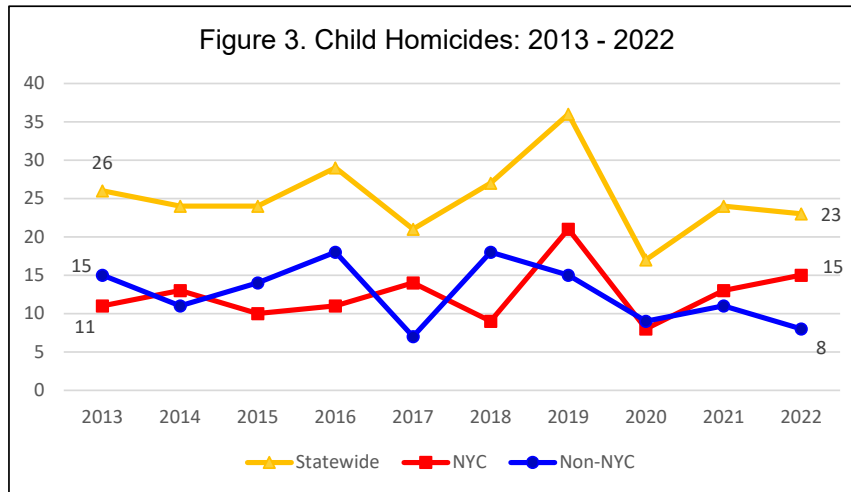

- The fewest number of intimate partner homicides Statewide during the 10-year period was 59 in 2017.
- There were 25 intimate partner homicides in New York City in 2019, the lowest reported since this report has been published. Those homicides outside New York City reached a low of 30 in 2018.

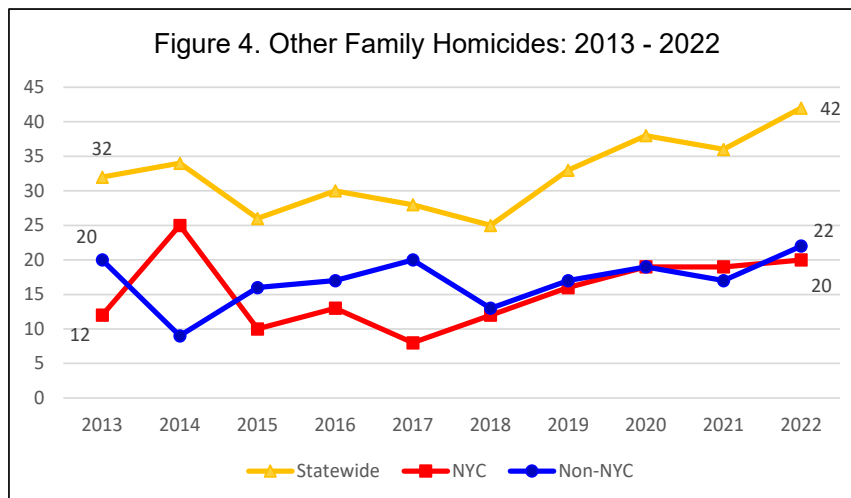
## Trends in Domestic Homicide 2013 - 2022

- Statewide, there was one fewer child victim of domestic homicide compare to 2021, after increasing 41 percent from 2020 to 2021. The number of child homicides reported by New York City has increased over the last three years with 15 reported in 2022.
- Non-New York City reported a decrease in child homicides this year (8) compared to last year (11).

- Other family homicides increased 17 percent compared to last year, with increases reported in both New York City (20 v 19) and Non-New York City (22 v 17).

The following counties, with no homicides of any type reported in 2022, are excluded from the table: Allegany, Cattaraugus, Chenango, Cortland, Essex, Greene, Hamilton, Herkimer, Lewis, Orleans, Putnam, Saratoga, Warren, Wyoming, and Yates. Eighteen counties with no domestic homicides but at least one other homicide in 2022 are included: Broome, Cayuga, Chautauqua, Columbia, Genesee, Livingston, Madison, Montgomery, Oneida, Ontario, Otsego, Schoharie, Schuyler, Seneca, Tioga, Tompkins, Washington, and Wayne.
